## You Have a Choice | John Eldredge

*"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14.27)*

Tucked away at the end of the 14th chapter of John, we find Jesus preparing His closest friends (and soon-to-be successors) for His departure. They still don't believe or don't want to believe He's leaving. Jesus says to them (and us): *"Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."*

I find this to be one of the most startling things Jesus says. I thought, "We have a choice? We let our hearts be troubled?" I've always assumed it was the other way around -- trouble strikes in some form or other, and the heart simply responds by being troubled. I'll bet you have felt this way too. Trouble descends upon you: your house is robbed, your daughter gets pregnant, you lose your job, your son runs away. In that moment are you thinking, *This doesn't have to take me out. I'm not going to let my heart be troubled?* No way. We think "troubled heart" is unavoidable, appropriate even. But Jesus is talking about His coming torture, His death, and, following that, His departure from them. On a scale of personal crises, this is a ten. Yet, He says, *"Don't let your hearts be troubled..."*

Friend, this is so important. You have a say in what your heart gives way to. Will you dwell on the fearful circumstances, or will you trust in Jesus who gives us peace?
